


TOWN OF SEEKONK STREET LIGHTING POLICY

To effectuate the re-lighting of street lights throughout the Town, this policy is hereby created. The goals of the policy are to establish criteria to be used to locate appropriate sites which will promote the public safety of the general public in either a motor vehicle or pedestrian setting as well as to create an on-going administrative procedure to record requests for lights, and contingent upon funding, the possible installation thereof. The location of a light to enhance private property protection or security is neither a goal nor a consideration of this policy.

1. The Police Department shall be responsible for the development of a list of suitable locations to install a street light. The department shall consider former light locations that were turned off due to prior year budget cutbacks, existing street lights paid for privately by residential or commercial property owners, or new locations.
2. The following factors shall be used by departmental staff when making their recommendations to the Police Chief as to suitable locations for consideration:
 - a. Roadway intersections
 - b. Sharp or dangerous curves in roadways
 - c. Roadways with long straight stretches
 - d. Densely populated areas
 - e. Cul-de-Sacs
3. The Police Chief shall forward to the Office of the Selectmen a listing of locations for a street light. The Board of Selectmen shall review the report and shall implement its recommendations, subject to any additions or deletions as voted by the Board. Thereafter, the Executive Secretary/Town Administrator, with the advice and assistance of the Police Department, shall maintain a record of potential sites for additional lighting. Subject to funding availability, the Executive Secretary/Town Administrator shall use this list to make a determination on new lighting.

This policy was approved and adopted by the Board of Selectmen on
May 3, 1995.
