



As you wander the quiet, idyllic trails around Gammino Pond, it's hard to imagine that a little more than fifty years ago it was a bustling sand and gravel quarry operation. The pond itself a remnant of that industrial legacy. Today, graveled roads are replaced with meandering trails and the once barren pond edge is dense with trees, shrubs and plants.

In partnership with state, Seekonk acquired the 59-acre property in 1988 through a self-help grant. The property was set aside for wildlife habitat preservation, water supply protection, and passive recreational purposes.

As one of the first conservation areas in town, it was several years before a formal network of trails was established. Now, residents and visitors can hike, jog, or bike along well-marked, maintained trails with access from the Newman Ave staging area, the Seekonk Meadows, or one of the neighborhood trailheads. The pond is also a great spot to enjoy some solitude while fishing, kayaking, or canoeing.

Be sure to visit Gammino Pond throughout the year to experience the seasonal changes. We hope you enjoy the recent improvements to the trails and staging area.

## Rules & Regulations

For everyone's safety and enjoyment, please observe the rules & regulations below.

TRAIL USAGE	Walk, jog, hike, and bike on established trails only. Trails are open daily from sunrise to sunset.
LITTER	Litter and dog waste can harm wildlife. Please dispose of it properly in the provided receptacles.
PETS	Pets must be licensed and restrained on a leash at all times.
WILDLIFE	All wildlife and resources are protected. Hunting is prohibited.
FISHING	Fishing is permitted. Catch & release recommended.
WATER ACCESS	Recreational water use, including use of kayaks and canoes, is permitted. Motorized boats are prohibited.
VEHICLES	Only non-motorized bicycles are permitted. All other recreational vehicles are prohibited.
ALCOHOL	Alcoholic beverages and glass containers are prohibited.
